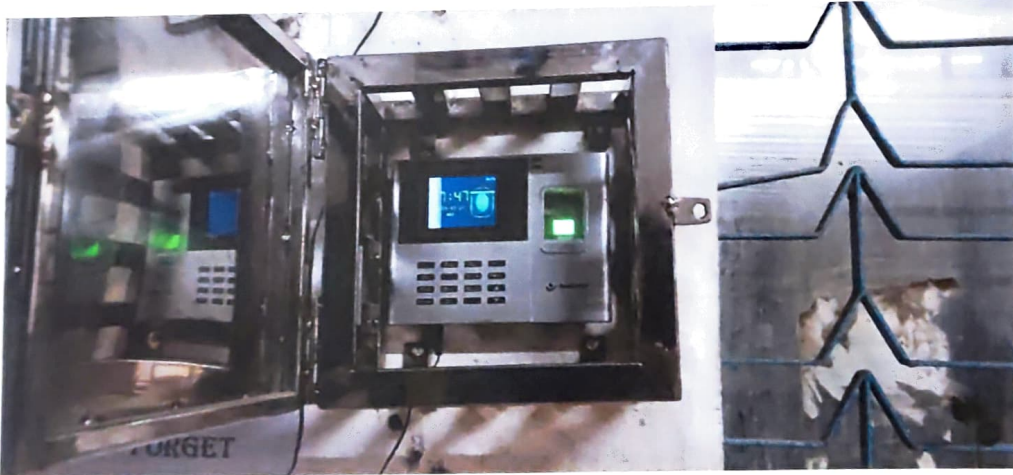
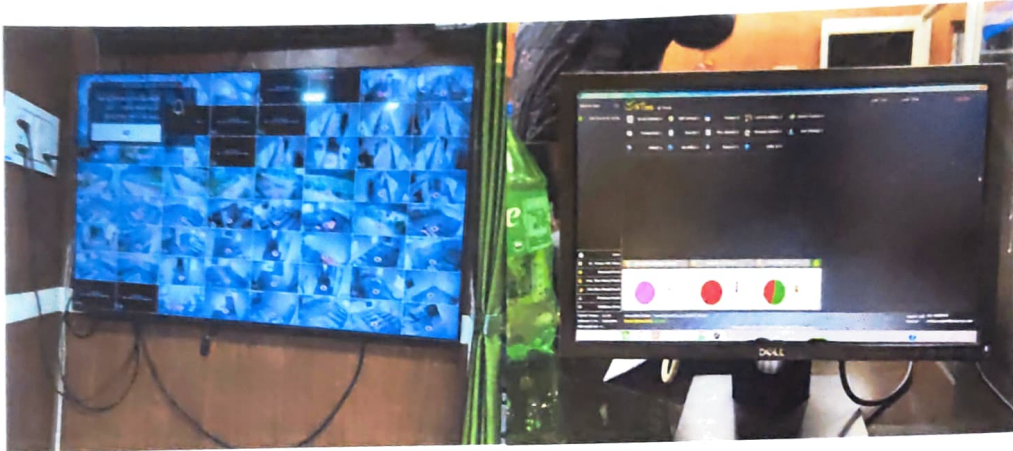




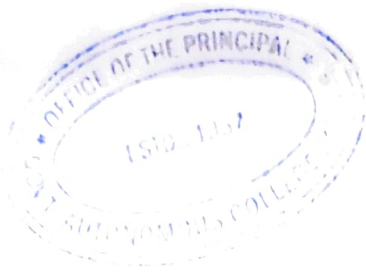

A. ACADEMIC ASSESSMENT : (PG)

1. The CBCS(Choice Based Credit System) of examination has been introduced for UG/PG from the session 2013-14
2. The P.G. course is of four semesters duration. Each semester examination shall consist of a Mid semester examination(theory 1 hour duration, practical 3 hours duration for departments having practical) and End semester examination(theory 3 hours, practical 6 hours wherever applicable). Mid semester and End semester examinations shall have the weightage of 30% and 70% respectively.
3. The Mid semester examination for each paper shall be conducted and valued by the teacher/teachers or any external faculty teaching that paper in the department. A student who fails to appear in a Mid semester examination, will be allowed to take the same examination with the next batch of students only ONCE. There will be NO provision to reappear in a Mid-semester examination for improvement.


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4. A candidate failing in any End semester examination will be allowed to appear in the End semester examination of that semester conducted for the next batch of students and shall be allowed to continue in the next higher semester. However, the candidates has to pass and/or improve (subject to clause 5) all the four End semester examinations within four academic years from the year of admission in to the first semester.

5. A candidate who has passed a semester examination may repeat for improvement only once in one more paper of that semester examination.

6. For passing a semester examination a candidate must secure 30% marks in each theory paper (i.e. 21 out of 70 in the End Semester) and 40% marks in each practical paper in the End semester examination.

7. Grading System in each paper (Mid(+)End semester examination) in a semester :

NB : A student has to secure Grade E or above to pass in each paper.

NB : In order to pass in a paper, the candidate has to fulfill the following terms and conditions

UG

- a. Must have written the Mid-Term Examination.
- b. Must secure 30% in the End-Semester Examination and 40% in Mid-Semester and End-Semester taken together.
- c. Must secure 40% in practical.

PG

- a. A student has to secure 30% in each paper to pass.

B. ACADEMIC ASSESSMENT : (UG)

1. ELIGIBILITY –

1.1 Higher Secondary/+2/Senior Secondary or any other equivalent examination passed from any Board/Council established by the Govt. of India or any State Govt. or any other equivalent examination recognized by Central Board of Secondary Education/Council of Higher Secondary Education, Govt. of Odisha/Department of Higher Education/ Department of Industry or any other Deptt of Govt. of Odisha or Utkal University. Those joining B.Sc. Programme must have passed the above examination under the faculty of Science/Technology/Engineering/Pharmacy etc. There shall be no such restriction for joining BA/B.Com stream.

1.2 Students ordinarily may be selected for admission through Entrance Test, Group Discussion and Personal Interview and/or a combination of these with due weightage to career to be decided by the Autonomous College or Director, Higher Education. DDCE would admit students on first come first serve basis. The Govt. of Odisha may lay down admission process for Colleges under control.

1.3 Admission Policy would be decided by the Academic Council of the respective Autonomous Colleges and for affiliated colleges Government will decide the admission policy.

1.4 Directorate of Distance & Continuing Education would decide its own admission policy.

2. DURATION –

2.1 The three years Degree course leading to Bachelor's Degree in Arts/Science/Commerce shall be spread over a period of three academic years i.e. six semesters. A candidate for Bachelor's Degree in Arts/Science/Commerce shall be required to pass the six semester examinations.

2.2 Odd semester is from July to December (i.e. 1st, 3rd & 5th semester). The examination shall be held normally in the month of November-December.

2.3 Even semester is from January to June (i.e. 2nd, 4th & 6th semester). The examination shall be held normally in the month of May-June. However, the Final Semester shall be conducted in April and result shall be published by end of May or as directed by the Higher Education Department, Govt. of Odisha.

2.4 A student would be required to complete the course within six academic years from the date of admission.

3. COMPULSORY REGISTRATION FOR 1ST SEMESTER –

- Registration for 1st semester is compulsory. A candidate admitted to +3 courses but not registered for 1st semester examination, his/her admission will be automatically cancelled.

- 75% attendance for non DDCE students is a requirement for being eligible to appear at Examination. Up to 15% waiver may be granted by the College Principal at discretion on Health Ground or participation in Sports, Cultural activities, NCC and NSS

activities etc.

- A Student may clear backlog papers within 6 Improvement if any has to be completed within 4 years.

A candidate has to secure 30% or above to pass in each of the Papers.

The candidate obtaining Grade-F is considered failed and will be required to clear the back paper(s) in the subsequent examinations within the stipulated time.

The candidate securing 'B' Grade and above in core/Honours papers in aggregate will be awarded Honours.

B.Com (Hons.) CBCS

The candidate securing 'B' Grade and above in aggregate in first appearance will be awarded Honours with Distinction. (Distinction for pass/regular course).

Any candidate filling the forms for appearing in back papers/improvement shall not be awarded Distinction.

5.2 A Student's level of competence shall be categorized by a **GRADE POINT AVERAGE** to be specified as-

SGPA – Semester Grade Point Average
CGPA- Cumulative Grade Point Average

- (a) **POINT** – Integer equivalent of each letter grade
- (b) **CREDIT** – Integer signifying the relative emphasis of individual course Item(s) in a semester as indicated by the Course structure and syllabus.

CREDIT POINT – (b) x (a) for each course item

CREDIT INDEX - \sum **CREDIT POINT** of course items

6. REPEAT OR BACK EXAMINATION –

6.1 A student has to clear back papers) i.e. in the paper/papers

- one has failed) by appearing at subsequent semester examinations within six years from the date of admission.
- 6.2 A student may appear improvement (repeat) in any number of papers in the immediate subsequent examination. The higher marks shall be retained.
- 6.3 Improvement has to be completed within 4 years from the date of admission.

A. SELF FINANCING COURSE –

(i) B.Sc. Computer Science (Honours) 60 Seats.

1. The Course fee of Rs.10,000/- is to be collected per year from

- each student at the time of admission.
2. Selection will be made either on mark obtained in +2 Science or through joint entrance Examination.
 3. Minimum mark 40% in aggregate and 40% in either Math. or Physics for election of honours.
 4. Basis of selection to aggregate mark excluding 4th optional Physics mark or Math. mark whichever is higher.
 5. Student desiring to discontinue the Course in the middle of the Course, will have to forfeit the amount already deposited in the College and in addition will have to deposit the course fees for the rest of the years before taking College Leaving Certificate.

B. PUBLICATION OF RESULTS -

The result of the three years B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Degree Examination and the Classes to be awarded shall be determined on the basis of the combined result of the six semesters taken together. Each Successful candidate at the Final Examination of the 3 years Degree Course shall receive a diploma in the prescribed form signed by the competent authority

C. COUNCIL EXAMINATION -

1. The course for Higher Secondary stage shall be of two years duration. At the end of the 1st year the council shall conduct the Terminal Examination on the course set for the 1st year class. The final examination will be conduct in the month of March every year.
2. On completion of the course the distribution of marks and papers shall be as follows.

Arts/Science/Commerce

Compulsory 200

Elective 400

Each paper carries 100 marks

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3. To pass a candidate must secure
 - (a) 30% marks in each subjects or group of subjects excluding practical papers.
 - (b) 40% marks in each practical paper.
4. 35% in aggregate.
5.
 - (a) 60% or above for 1st Division
 - (b) 50% to 59% for 2nd Division.
 - (c) 30% to 49% for 3rd Division.

D. COLLEGE EXAMINATION –

The College shall conduct the following examinations for different classes on the dates that shall be notified by the Principal.

(a) Pretest Examinations.
(For Second year Higher Secondary Classes).

(b) First Terminal Examination.
(For First Year Higher Secondary classes)

(c) Test Examination.
(For Second year Higher Secondary Classes)

(d) Annual Examination
(For first year Higher Secondary Classes).

RULES FOR EXAMINEES –

1. A Student has to take all the examinations in order to earn his/her progress certificate. A student who absents himself/herself from the Annual/Test examination will be fined at the rate fixed unless, he/she applies to the Principal in writing with supporting evidence for exemption of fines.

2. Students not appearing at the First Terminal and Annual



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examination shall not be promoted to the next higher class. Students not appearing at Pretest and Test examination shall not be sent up as per the regulation of the Council/University. Exceptional cases, however, shall be decided as would be deemed fit by the Principal. A student has to secure at least 20% marks in each subject to be eligible for being sent up for the final examination.

3. A student found in possession of incriminating material or copying or using any other unfair means in order to gain any unfair advantage in the examination will be expelled from the examination hall and will be refused promotion which he/she otherwise might have earned, or he/she may be penalized in some other form deemed proper.


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
